# FR. ANTONIO'S CORNER



## A Reflection for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Lord, Open my Eyes!

Mark narrates the healing of the blind Bartimaeus to urge Christian communities to leave their blindness and mediocrity. It is a hidden criticism to James and John who in the Gospel of last Sunday demanded from Jesus positions of privilege. Prophet Isaiah prophesized about them already: "they have ears, but do not listen, have eyes, and cannot see." In fact, the word Timaeus can also be a diminishing term to describe arrogance, a superiority complex of the two disciples.

The story is a remarkably relevant for the Church today. Bartimaeus is "a blind beggar sitting by the roadside." In his life, it is always dark. He has heard of Jesus but has not seen His face. He cannot follow Him.

Is not this our situation? Are not we blind Christians, sitting by the road, unable to follow Jesus on his way to Jerusalem, to the Cross? Among us it is also dark. We do not know Jesus. We need His light to move on. We ignore where the Church is moving. We do not even know what future we want for her. We are safely installed in a religion made up to our own liking, which hinders us from becoming followers of Jesus. Like James and John, we want glory and power.

However, despite his blindness,

Bartimaeus captures that Jesus is passing by him. Not doubting for an instant, he seizes this unique opportunity. Something tells him that Jesus is his only salvation: "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me." This cry repeated several times with faith will trigger his healing.

Today we hear in the church all sorts of complaints, criticisms, protests and mutual disqualifications. Often the humble and confident prayer of the blind cannot be heard. We have forgotten that only Jesus can save this church, not our theology, doctrine or canon law. Theologies, doctrines, and laws blur our vision to perceive the loving and compassionate presence of Jesus nearby. We are full of selfishness, like James and John.

The blind man cannot see, but he knows how to listen to the voice of Jesus that comes through his envoys: "Take courage, rise, he is calling you." The blind man reacts admirably: threw away his cloak, which prevented him to get up, and jumped forward despite his darkness and kneels in front of Jesus. He only has one request: "Master, I want to see." He knows that with his eyes opened, everything will change. The Gospel concludes that the blind received his sight and he "followed Jesus on the way," of course, to Jerusalem, the Cross, something James and John were reluctant to do. We need to open our eyes to see Jesus.

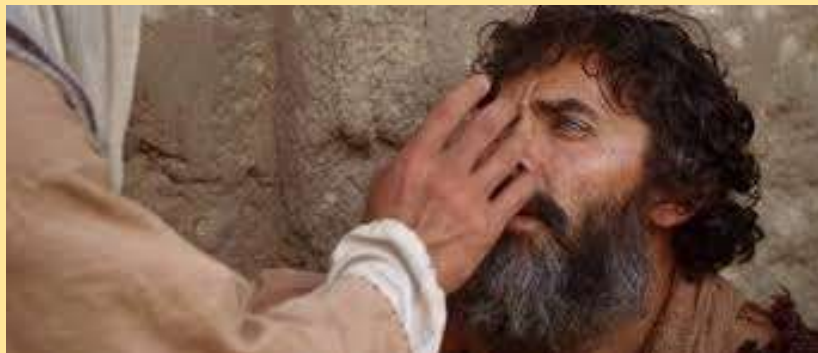

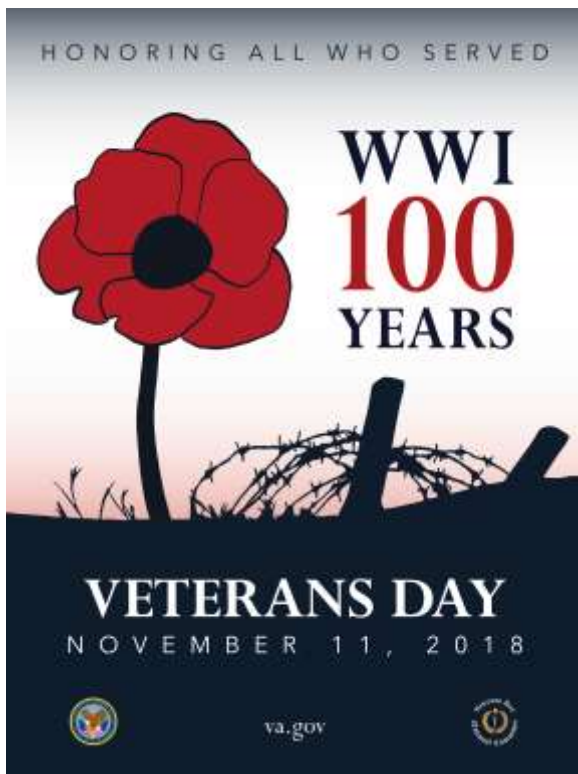

# AVISOS PARA NUESTRA COMUNIDAD HISPANA



## ¡Señor, abre mis ojos!

Marcos narra la curación del ciego Bartimeo para instar a las comunidades cristianas a dejar su ceguera y su mediocridad. Es una crítica oculta a Santiago y Juan, quienes, en el Evangelio del domingo pasado, exigieron a Jesús puestos de privilegio. El profeta Isaías ya profetizó acerca de ellos: "tienen oídos, pero no escuchan, tienen ojos y no pueden ver". De hecho, la palabra Timeo también es un término despreciativo para describir arrogancia, complejo de superioridad de los dos discípulos.

La historia es muy relevante para la Iglesia de hoy. Bartimeo es "un mendigo ciego sentado al borde del camino". En su vida, siempre está oscuro. Él ha oído hablar de Jesús, pero no ha visto Su rostro. Él no puede seguirlo.

¿No es esta nuestra situación?  
¿No somos cristianos ciegos, sentados a la vera del camino, incapaces de seguir a Jesús en su subida a Jerusalén, a la Cruz?

Entre nosotros también todo es oscuro. No conocemos a Jesús. Necesitamos su luz para seguir adelante. Ignoramos hacia dónde se mueve la Iglesia. Ni siquiera sabemos qué futuro queremos para ella. Estamos instalados de forma segura en una religión hecha a nuestro gusto, lo que nos impide convertirnos en seguidores de Jesús. Al igual que Santiago y Juan, queremos gloria y poder.

Sin embargo, a pesar de su ceguera, Bartimeo capta que Jesús pasa por su lado. Sin dudar por un instante, aprovecha esta oportunidad única. Algo le dice que Jesús es su única salvación: "Jesús, Hijo de David, ten misericordia de mí". Este grito repetido varias veces con fe desencadenará su curación.

Hoy escuchamos en la iglesia todo tipo de quejas, críticas, protestas y descalificaciones mutuas. A menudo, la oración humilde y segura de los ciegos no se puede escuchar. Hemos olvidado que solo Jesús puede salvar esta iglesia, no nuestra teología, doctrina o derecho canónico. Las teologías, las doctrinas y las leyes desdibujan nuestra visión de percibir la presencia amorosa y compasiva de Jesús cerca. Estamos llenos de egoísmo, como Santiago y Juan.



El ciego no puede ver, pero sabe escuchar la voz de Jesús que llega a través de sus enviados: "Animo, levántate, te está llamando". El ciego reacciona admirablemente: arrojó su capa, que le impedía levantarse, y saltó hacia adelante a pesar de su oscuridad y se arrodilló frente a Jesús. Solo tiene una petición:

"Maestro, quiero ver". Él sabe que, con los ojos abiertos, todo cambiará. El Evangelio concluye que el ciego recibió su vista y "siguió a Jesús en el camino", por supuesto, a Jerusalén, la Cruz, algo que Santiago y Juan se mostraron reacios a hacer. Necesitamos abrir nuestros ojos para ver a Jesús.

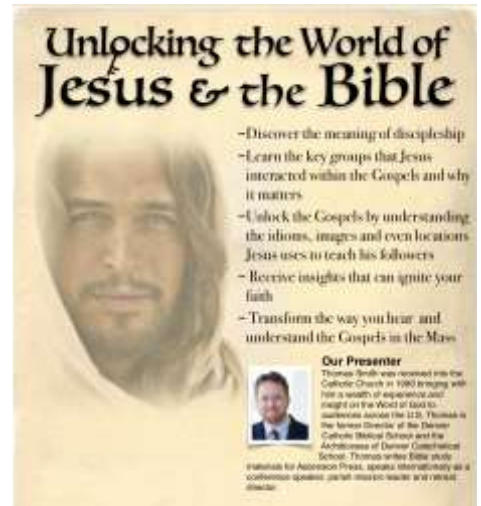
### FEATURED PARISH MINISTRY:

#### WOMEN'S FOURTH DAY

This week we pray in gratitude for those serving our parish community through the ministry of the **Women's Fourth Day**. Lord bless those who are serving in this ministry with courage and perseverance and grant that many will be inspired by their example

and faith. Help the men and women of our parish to hear your call to serve our community in a ministry to address their own needs and those of our parish who thirst for your presence.

Women's Fourth Day ministry here at the Cathedral is a follow-up/continuation of the Catholic Cursillo Movement, a consecutive 72 hour period called a "Three Day Weekend." It was founded in Majorca, Spain by a group of laity in 1944 while they were refining a technique to train pilgrimage Christian leaders. Then the Cursillo Movement in the United States was established in 1965. Today, Cursillo is a worldwide movement for both men and women. During the three day weekend, a team of religious and lay personnel present a series of talks to the participants and the entire group calls upon the Holy Spirit for enlightenment and guidance. Throughout the weekend the participants will pray together, attend daily mass and have an opportunity to receive the sacrament of reconciliation. Typically, by the end of the weekend, participants have a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. The challenge, however, is sustaining this and that's why "Fourth Day" was established. We're fortunate to have this ministry here at our parish has a way to continue informing this spiritual journey.
