FR. ANTONIO'S CORNER



A Reflection for the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Blessed the Poor

The contrast between the two gospel scenes is total. In the first, Jesus puts people on guard against the scribes of the temple. Their religion is a false one: they use religion only to seek their own glory and to exploit the weak people who try to find comfort from their fears in religion. No one is to admire and follow their example.

In the second scene, Jesus observed the gesture of a poor widow, and calls upon his disciples to pay attention to it. From this woman they can learn something the scribes never taught the faithful: a total faith in God and boundless generosity.

Jesus' criticism directed to the scribes is a harsh one. These leaders, instead of guiding the people to God seeking His glory, attract the attention of people towards themselves seeking their own honor. They like "walking with flowing robes" and demand the people greet and bow their heads in front of them. In the liturgy of the synagogues and at banquets, they seek "seats of honor" and "the first places."

However, something certainly hurts **Jesus more than the Pharisees' fatuous and childish behavior** demanding attention and empty reverence. While they feign deep piety in their "long prayers" in public (to be seen), they take

advantage of their religious prestige to live at the expense (in the expression of the biblical tradition) of widows, weak and defenseless beings of Israel.

It was precisely one of these widows, who will expose the corrupt religion of these religious leaders. Her gesture has gone unnoticed to everyone, but not Jesus. The poor woman has thrown only **two small coins into the temple's treasury box.** Jesus noticed it and called immediately his disciples, because they would not have been able to find in the difficult environment of a religious temple someone with such a religious and solidary heart in favor of the needy.

This widow is not looking for honors or prestige; she acts in a quiet and humble way. She does not think of exploiting anyone; on the contrary, he gives everything she has because others may need her help. According to Jesus, she has given more than anyone else has, because she did not give from her "surplus" but from "all she has to live."

Make no mistake. These simple people, with a big and generous heart, who know how to love unconditionally, are the best asset the Church has. These people make the world more humane. These ones truly believe in God and keep alive the spirit of Jesus among other false and interested religious attitudes. From these, we must learn to follow Jesus.

About the exhibit This Vatican-approved international exhibit was designed and created by the late Carlo Acutis who died too soon of leukemia at age 15. His goal during his short life was to help bring others closer to Jesus through awareness of the mystery of the Eucharist. The exhibit is presented in the United States by the Real Presence Eucharistic Education and Adoration Society, and is locally sponsored by Salt & Light Radio. The display features detailed panels highlighting some of the most powerful Eucharistic miracles of the world. The display's purpose is to increase awareness of the Real Presence of our Lord in the Eucharist and promote Eucharistic adoration. Donations collected are used for the upkeep of the exhibit and for print materials.

What is a Eucharistic Miracle? Eucharistic miracles consist of unexplainable phenomena occurring after transubstantiation, such as a host visibly transforming into human tissue, a host surviving fire, a host bleeding or the Eucharist alone providing sustenance to a human being for a prolonged period of time. HONORING OUR VETERANS



JOHN REGAN “Killed in action at Fismis, August 4, 1918. Pray for him” Those are the final two lines engraved on a plaque on the right side of the old high altar which graces the back of our sanctuary. John was the first, but not the last member of St. Johns Parish to die in the First World War. Fellow parishioners **ROBERT FENWICK** and **WILLIAM PENROD** also died in the “war to end all wars.” John was born in Silver City in 1886. His father Timothy Regan was a successful business man and head of the finance committee which built our Cathedral. He attended St. Theresa’s Academy and graduated “maxima cum laude” from Santa Clara College in California. He joined the Idaho National Guard as a private but was soon commissioned a second lieutenant. The Idaho National Guard was federalized and sent to France in November of 1917. John was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross in his service in that conflict. On July 31, 1918, after 10 months of the wreckage and horror of war John wrote his last letter home to his mother. “My God, what a price a country pays for war,” he commented. Four



days later John himself would pay the ultimate price in that war. He was killed in an artillery barrage on the American lines. He was initially buried on the battlefield in France, but in 1921 his family had his remains returned and interred in the Regan family plot at Morris Hill Cemetery.



HERB POKORNI Died in World War II. Uncle and namesake to St. John’s parishioner Herb Krakau.



JIM NOURSE Enlisted in the US Navy in 1968. After Basic Training, was deployed to Vietnam. Lived for awhile in “Hotel Annapolis” in Saigon. Lodging was \$.25 per night, which didn’t include a bed. One Sunday, Jim’s barracks were mortared. Fortunately, the men were in another area of the compound, watching a boxing match. Served on the USS Mt. McKinley, a flagship communications vessel in Danang Harbor. Home port was Subic Bay in the Philippines. Served in Vietnam theater from 1968-1970. returned to serve decommissioning ships in San Diego. Honorably discharged from the US Navy in 1974. Served 24 years afterward in Idaho Air National Guard and Idaho Army National Guard.

PHIL TOOMEY US Army 37th Engineer Group (Combat) Communications Specialist, Hanau, West Germany 1960-1962



RASH IGLESIAS served in World War II in the United States Army, 899th Signal Depot Company from 1942 to December 25, 1945. He was based out of Fort Douglas, Utah. Decorations include: European African Middle Eastern Service Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal AR 600-68, Victory Medal



CAPTAIN TOM TROTTER USNR-R, is a Vietnam and Desert Shield/Storm veteran. During the course of his 27-year career, he has held five commands in the Naval Reserve establishment, including units that augmented ship companies, communication stations, and more recently, a NATO maritime forces unit that frequently mobilized in support of active NATO operations during the Yugoslavian conflict and the Gulf War.



EDMUND A. BOGERT, JR. (DEE) age 93 served in World War II. He enlisted February 28, 1943 and went overseas with the 100th Division, 398th Regiment, Love Company. Dee first landed in France on October 20, 1944 in Marseille, France. The fighting Dee was involved in started near Epinal, France and moved through the Vosges Mountains of North Eastern France. The fighting in the Vosges Mountains began in November of 1944 with a culmination of those actions in March 1945. It was in March 1945 their unit secured Bitche, France along the Maginot Line then progressed forward toward Heilbronn, Germany. Just prior to crossing into Germany Dee contracted hepatitis and was sent back to hospital for recovery. While he was recuperating in hospital the war ended so Dee didn’t have to fight anymore.

Dee was born in Lewistown, Montana but grew up in Pocatello. He attended Idaho State College (University) 1942-1943, & 1946. Dee ended up graduating from Harvard University in 1949. Dee was recalled into the Army in 1950, attended the Defense Language Institute in Monterey, CA to study the Czech language from 1951 to 1952. Dee was then posted, as part of a Military Intelligence unit, to Regensburg, Germany. Now a First Lieutenant, Dee interviewed Czech refugees coming across the border into Germany. Upon completion of his service Dee returned home to Pocatello to take over the ownership of the Chevrolet dealership (Intermountain Chevrolet), which he ran from 1953-1970.

AVISOS PARA NUESTRA COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Bienaventurados los Pobres

El contraste entre las dos escenas del evangelio es total. En el primero, Jesús pone a las personas en guardia contra los escribas del templo. Su religión es falsa: usan la religión solo para buscar su propia gloria y para explotar a las personas

débiles que tratan de encontrar consuelo en sus temores en la religión. Nadie debe admirar y seguir su ejemplo. En la segunda escena, Jesús observó el gesto de una viuda pobre y pidió a sus discípulos que le prestaran atención. De esta mujer pueden aprender algo que los escribas nunca enseñaron a los fieles: una fe total en Dios y una generosidad sin límites.

La crítica de Jesús dirigida a los escribas es dura. Estos líderes, en lugar de guiar a la gente hacia Dios en busca de Su gloria, atraen la atención de las personas hacia sí mismas en busca de su propio honor. Les gusta "caminar con túnicas sueltas" y exigen que las personas saluden y inclinen sus cabezas frente a ellos. En la liturgia de las sinagogas y en los banquetes, buscan "asientos de honor" y "los primeros lugares".

Sin embargo, algo ciertamente le duele a Jesús más que el comportamiento fatuo e infantil de los fariseos que exige atención y reverencia vacía. Mientras fingen profunda piedad en sus "largas

oraciones" en público (a la vista), aprovechan su prestigio religioso para vivir a expensas (en la expresión de la tradición bíblica) de viudas, seres débiles e indefensos de Israel.

Fue precisamente una de estas viudas, quienes expondrán la religión corrupta de estos líderes religiosos. Su gesto ha pasado desapercibido para todos, pero no para Jesús. La pobre mujer ha tirado solo dos monedas pequeñas en la caja del tesoro del templo. Jesús lo notó y



llamó inmediatamente a sus discípulos, porque no habrían podido encontrar en el difícil entorno de un templo religioso a alguien con un corazón tan religioso y solidario en favor de los necesitados.

Esta viuda no busca honores ni prestigio; Ella actúa de manera tranquila y humilde. Ella no piensa en explotar a nadie; por el contrario, él da todo lo que ella tiene porque otros pueden necesitar su ayuda. Según Jesús, ella ha dado más que nadie, porque no dio de su "excedente" sino de "todo lo que tiene que vivir".

No cometer errores. Estas personas sencillas, con un corazón grande y generoso, que saben amar incondicionalmente, son el mejor activo que tiene la Iglesia. Estas personas hacen que el mundo sea más humano. Estos realmente creen en Dios y mantienen vivo el espíritu de Jesús entre otras actitudes religiosas falsas e interesadas. De estos, debemos aprender a seguir a Jesús.


